All livestock are encouraged to display for the entire six (6) days of the Fair (check with superintendent to see if barn space is available).

All livestock entries must be made to the Twin Falls County Extension Office before 5:00 p.m. Monday, July 17, 2017. All livestock and FFA exhibits must be on Fairgrounds before 5:00 p.m. Tuesday, August 29th.

All open Lot livestock entries must be made to the Twin Falls County Fair Office before 5:00 p.m. August 23rd. **All cultural entry forms will be accepted at the Twin Falls County Fair Office until Sunday, August 27th.**

All prize money must be signed for. No entry fee will be charged for entries in the FFA division. All livestock entered in open Lot must follow open Lot rules and regulations. All produce must be taken to the building by 5 p.m., Sunday, August 2th. Exhibitors must furnish feed and care for his/her own stock. The Fair Management will dispose of all exhibits not called for at close of Fair. The exhibitors of all livestock must be owned, or have financial interest in stock to receive premium money. All FFA projects must have been properly listed with their local advisor by June. All winners will receive ribbons as well as cash awards. FFA members that are showing are required to purchase a \$10.00 wristband from the Twin Falls County Extension Office.

Entries are limited to FFA members in Chapters in Twin Falls County.

FFA members will be required to participate in a showmanship Lot consisting of a Junior Lot (grades 8, 9, 10) and a Senior Lot (grades 11, 12, 13). If for any reason there are not enough exhibitors for both Lots, the FFA Superintendent for each individual species will determine if the Junior and Senior Lot will be combined. In any circumstance, the FFA participants will be allowed to show in an exclusive FFA Showmanship Lot. All decisions regarding FFA Showmanship Lots will be directed to the FFA Superintendent for that species.

For safety purposes, boots are to be worn at all times during this competition.

FITTING AND SHOWING CONTEST

1. The FFA Fitting and Showing contest shall be divided in two groups:
 - (a) Junior Division shall include students who are currently 8th grade, freshman, and sophomores.
 - (b) Senior Division shall include students who are currently juniors, seniors, and who have graduated in the previous school year.
2. All animals must be fitted before they enter the ring.
3. Dress code: FFA Jackets, white shirt, tie/scarf and dark colored pants. Dairy whites with FFA Jackets for dairy & goats.

CROP EXHIBITS

1. Each FFA member may exhibit as many different crops as he/she wishes, but these exhibits must be grown on a farm owned or rented by himself/herself and raised as his/her own project.
2. All farm produce shall be the same rules as listed in the premium book for open Lot exhibits.
3. Each FFA Chapter will receive \$5.00 for showing a display. Funds will go to FFA Chapter. Premium No. 70.
4. Each FFA Chapter, which has 15 or more FFA members displaying produce at the Twin Falls County Fair, will receive a \$75.00 cash award payable to the respective FFA Chapter.
5. FFA Vegetables & Field Crops will be displayed with open Lot exhibits. Exhibits will be judged twice, once in FFA and once in open Lot, if entered at such.

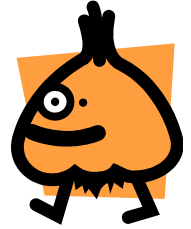
